Attorney Jill Davies works on a local, state, and national level to build comprehensive responses to family violence. She has trained and consulted extensively on family violence, advocacy and safety planning, poverty, and legal issues. She is the deputy director of Greater Hartford Legal Aid and directs the Building Comprehensive Solutions to Domestic Violence Initiative, a project of the National Resource Center on Domestic Violence, in collaboration with GHLA..

Attorney Davies is the author of numerous articles and materials regarding violence against women. She is co-author of the book, *Safety Planning with Battered Women: Complex Lives/Difficult Choices*, Sage Publications, 1998. Her BCS publications include, *Policy Blueprint on Domestic Violence and Poverty* and *Introduction to Policy Advocacy and Analysis: Improving How Systems Respond to Battered Women*-a curriculum for advocates. She is also the author of: *Helping Sexual Assault Survivors with Multiple Victimizations and Needs: A Guide for Agencies Serving Sexual Assault Survivors: Confidentiality and Information Sharing Issues for Domestic Violence Advocates Working with Child Protection and Juvenile Court Systems*; and a series of papers about domestic violence and the Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act of 1996.

This workshop will cover how attorneys and advocates can work together with survivors to develop and strengthen their safety plans. Among the topics covered will be: risk review with survivors; assessing dangerousness; responding to life-threatening violence and risks to children; advocacy and safety planning when the survivor will remain in the relationship or in contact with a current or former partner; and integrating legal and other safety strategies. Faculty will demonstrate safety planning techniques, and participants will apply knowledge by working with case studies.
