

“Workshop Analysis”

This presentation will identify ways in which stalkers and abusers use emerging technology to intimidate, harass and monitor their victims. It will offer current effective investigative and prosecution strategies as well as model approaches in educating communities and victims. This workshop will also identify signs of a batterers’ undue influence over a victim, describe how a batterer’s intimidation of a victim can take various forms and interfere with both the investigation and the subsequent prosecution of the offender and identify victim behaviors that are attempts to cope with their battering. This information can result in better-tailored risk assessments and safety planning and contribute to building and employing new police strategies to hold intimidators accountable for their obstruction of victims’ access to justice and for their manipulation of the justice system, training responders to identify and document victim intimidation and obstruction of justice. With this improved investigation response the training will demonstrate how to hold abusers accountable even when victims do not participate at trial.

Jeffrey P. Greipp

Prior to his present appointment collaborating with prosecutors and law enforcement nationally as an Attorney Adviser with Washington DC based AEquitas, Jeff Greipp served from 1999 to 2009 as an Assistant District Attorney in Milwaukee County, spending the majority of his career in sensitive crimes (sexual assault and crimes against children) and domestic violence and organized crime and racketeering prosecutions with the US Atty's Office prior to appointment as the Head of the Domestic Violence Division in 2006.

ADA Greipp also served on the WI DA's Assn exec board and as V.P. for the WI Assn of State Prosecutors (2005-2009), representing all 425+ elected and appointed prosecutors, testifying on their behalf in Senate Judiciary Committee hearings. WI's Governor appointed him to serve on several legislative committees where he drafted dozens of revisions to state law. In 2005 he redrafted the state's crimes against children criminal code, intimidation laws, human trafficking and DNA reforms.

As a prosecutor he helped design and implement the Milwaukee County Witness Protection Program, he re-structured the office warrant and subpoena systems, helped create office divisions and implemented the first prisoner community re-entry program and community prosecution victim advocacy program while lobbying congress and securing and supervising millions of dollars in federal earmarks and grants.

In addition to his current work he also serves as an Adjunct Prof. of Law at Marquette Law School teaching courses in trial advocacy and criminal law. His publications include law updates for the American Bar Association and the U.S. DOJ nationally distributes training materials that profile his jury trials and criminal intimidation and prosecution theories.

He has received numerous awards and has been recognized repeatedly in Super Lawyer Magazine as a "Rising Star" prosecutor. He has completed 8 marathons and is an avid scuba diver.
